



CORRECT ANSWER = 5¢








- 1,979 OBESE INDIVIDUALS FOLLOWED FOR 4 YEARS AFTER DIET PROGRAM
- THREE DIFFERENT GROUPS: WEIGHT LOSS, WEIGHT GAIN, WEIGHT SAME




